For a number of weeks now, our scripture readings in worship have included passages from 2 Corinthians. On June 30, we read from chapter 8, and verse 12 stood out to me: "If the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has- not according to what one does not have." give only from what you have, not from what you don't have, Paul writes.

These words reminded me of a line from the liturgy for Holy Communion. During the prayer of thanksgiving at the table, we say that we give thanks to God "not as we ought but as we are able." Our praise is never enough– God is worthy of so much more– but we still give the praise we can, the best we can, as often as we can.

Whether it's our financial giving, our service to our neighbor, or our praise of God, what we have to offer can often feel inadequate. But God can work with what we bring, however imperfect or incomplete it is. I included above one more quote I find especially moving. It's from a homily by Father Ken Untener. It's worth reading the longer passage (found <u>here</u>), which is a powerful reminder that God's mission in the world extends beyond our lifetimes. We can never do it all, but what we *can* do is worth doing.

When you're feeling overwhelmed by how much you're *not* doing for the sake of the Gospel, you can come back to these reminders that you're only asked to do your part and to keep faith that God can do the rest.
